The NKC clubhouse will be used as a dry changing room going forward i.e. before sessions, and for storage of bags whilst on the water. Should members leave valuables in their bags, they do so at their own risk. Members are therefore advised to bring a dry bag and take valuables on the water with them. Note: Ventilation to the clubhouse has been improved through the addition of additional air vents. Prior to and after members take to the water, the clubhouse door will remain open to enhance ventilation. Spread of COVID-19 coronavirus – Injury Treatment	First Aiders	 Injuries should still be treated, as participant safety is of the utmost importance. First Aiders should take care to protect themselves and others through rigorous cleaning and personal hygiene. Wearing face coverings is recommended for both First Aiders and casualties, where this is possible and practical. After contact with an injured participant, First Aiders should clean their hands thoroughly with soap and water or hand sanitiser at the earliest opportunity. This is applicable to all situations, regardless of whether there was close contact or minimal social distancing was maintained.
